Year	Event
1962	Womens hours extended. During the week, almost all women (not freshman whose hours are 10:30pm) are extended to midnight. Weekend hours for all women are extended to 1:00am on Fridays and Saturdays, Sunday's hours are still midnight.
1963	IBM computer mixer held as a social get-together for students. The Feminine Mystique by Betty Friedan is published in February.
1964	The Civil Rights Act that includes Title 7 is passed into law barring discrimination basis of sex in relation of employment.
1966	"No hours" policy for senior or women over 21.
1968	Story County grand jury believes student radicals use campus media to promote illicit sex, drugs, draft evasion, etc. to the detriment of the nation and to its leaders.
1969	Dorms go co-ed in Friley
1970	YWCA offers first women's studies course Guests of opposite sex can be in residence halls Creation of the Women's Coalition Black Cultural center opens
1971	First black Queen of any event, she was crowned Queen of Residence Hall Week First Human Sexualities Symposium was held First school year without women's hours NOW first announces law suit against ISU for sex discrimination
1972	Establishment of the University Committee on Women Title IX is signed into law
1973	ISU women play their first intercollegiate games as a varsity sport Roe Vs. Wade
1974	NOW sues ISU for sex discrimination First official women's week- Oct. 10-16 Army ROTC admits women Physical Education Departments for men and women are combined.
1975	International Women's Year October 25th- Alice Doesn't Day
1977	Women's studies program is created
1979	College of Design is created.
